

Organized by and on view at both the **Harrison Museum of African American Culture** and the **Taubman Museum of Art** through March 31, this special show features 200 drawings and 150 handwritten stories by late Roanoke artist David Ramey, Sr., chronicling the artist's youthful memories of his beloved Henry Street, Gainsboro, and Northeast prior to the impacts of national urban renewal programs. The exhibition is free and welcoming to all at both museums.
